

Africa Town is charged with cleaning the streets throughout the district four days per week which includes sweeping the sidewalks and gutters, bagging the trash and wiping down street furniture and keeping the planters free of debris. They will also provide incident reports on homeless encampments, public health incidents and city street improvements services to 311.

Giant Steps

Giant Steps is charged with managing trash pickup, power washing the sidewalks on a monthly basis and Graffiti removal will be handled within 48 hours of notification. Through the Giant Steps programs, adults with developmental disabilities are given the training and tools to become active and productive members of their community. Giant Steps is responsible for LPVCC Zone 2. GLPVCCBID is thankful that the Giant Steps program has joined the team!

Community Build Inc. launched March 14, 2020 the Community Response System of South Los Angeles (CRSSLA.org)


